Obama Selects Harold Varmus to Lead National Cancer Institute

President Obama has announced his intent to appoint Harold Varmus, MD to lead the National Cancer Institute (NCI). Dr. Varmus formerly directed the National Institutes of Health and won the 1989 Noble Prize in Physiology / Medicine for his work that elucidated the cellular origin of retroviral oncogenes. Most recently he served as president of Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center.
